Times the Generals have allowed 1 run or less in a game

**TODAY'S GAME:** The Generals host the Tennessee Smokies tonight for game two of a five-game series at Pringles Park, with Jackson leading the series 1-0 and season series 4-2. The two teams will meet a total of 24 times during the 2012 season, including 10 times in Jackson.

**GENERALS RECAP:** – RH Andrew Carraway allowed 1 run on 5 hits in 5.0 innings as Jackson beat Tennessee 5-1 on Wednesday night. Carraway became the first General to 3 wins. LH Brian Moran (1.0,0,0,0,0,1), RH Yoervis Medina (2.0,0,0,0,1,1) and RH Stephen Pryor (1.0,2,0,0,0,3) combined for 4.0 shutout innings out of the pen. The Generals sent 8 men to the plate and jumped out to a 3-0 lead in the bottom of the 2nd inning with RBI from LF Chris Pettit (1x3, R, RBI), SS Gabriel Noriega (1x4, RBI) and 3B Francisco Martinez (1x4, RBI, BB). After Tennessee brought in a run in the 4th inning, Jackson picked up solo homers from C Jesus Sucre (1x4, R, HR, RBI) in the 6th and Joe Dunigan (1x4, R, HR, RBI) in the 7th to take a 5-1 advantage. Denny Almonte led the Generals with a 3x4 night, extending his hitting streak to 7 games. Rich Poythress (1x3, R, 2B, BB) went 1x3 extending his hitting streak to 9 games.

**WHO'S HOT?:** In 5 starts this season, Andrew Caraway is 3-0 with a 2.63 ERA (8 ER, 27.1 IP). He has limited opponents to a .252 (26x103) average, while walking 4 and striking out 23. Nick Franklin, who had a day off yesterday, has recorded 3 consecutive 3-hit games and extended his hit streak to 6 games. During the streak he is batting .464 (13x28) with 4 runs scored, 3 doubles, 1 home run and 4 RBI. Denny Almonte currently has a 7-game hit streak, while also hitting safely in 10 of his last 12 games. During the last 12 games he is batting .426 (20x47) with 5 runs scored, 3 doubles, 4 home runs and 9 RBI. During this stretch he has raised his season average from .179 to .333. Rich Poythress extended his hit streak to 9 games, batting .371 (13x35) with 7 runs scored, 5 doubles, 1 home run and 8 RBI. LH Brian Moran (10.0) and RH Moises Hernandez (8.1) have yet to allow a run this season.

**DOMINATING THE LEAGUE:** The Generals pitching staff has struck out a league-best 185 batters so far this season and also lead the league with a 2.58 ERA. The next best is Mobile with a 3.22 ERA.

**ORGANIZATIONAL RANKINGS:** The Mariners were recently ranked by Baseball America No. 6 in their annual organizational talent ratings...this is a drastic improvement from when the Mariners were ranked 18th prior to last season.

**25 STRAIGHT GAMES:** The Generals are in the midst of the longest stretch of games without a day off. Jackson plays everyday from April 5 to April 29, having their first day off finally on April 30.

**GENERALS BOAST FOUR TOP 100 PROSPECTS:** The Generals opening day roster features four top 100 prospects, according to MLB.com. Pitchers Danny Hultzen (16), Taijuan Walker (18) and James Paxton (77) and short stop Nick Franklin (52).

**MARINERS FUTURE IN JACKSON:** Baseball America lists 10 Generals as top 30 Mariners prospects in their latest publication, including the top four and five of the top six on the list. P Taijuan Walker (1), P Danny Hultzen (2), P James Paxton (3), INF Nick Franklin (4), INF Francisco Martinez (6), P Stephen Pryor (15), P Carter Capps (16), P Brandon Maurer (21), OF Johermyn Chavez (28), INF Rich Poythress (29)

 1997 - Ryne Sandberg breaks Joe Morgan's major league record for home runs by a second baseman with his 267th career blast at the position in a 7-6 Cubs' victory over the Pirates. Sandberg hit the first five home runs of his career as a third baseman before he moved over to second.

**Tonight's Start:** 23-year-old left-hander James Paxton makes the game two start tonight for the Generals against the Tennessee Smokies at Pringles Park. It is his second start this season against the Smokies. It's his 25th career outing, 25th career start for the third-year right-hander out of Ladner, British Columbia, Canada.

**Last Outing:** Paxton did not survive the third inning last Saturday in Huntsville, allowing seven runs, six earned on seven hits, walking five and striking out just one in a no decision. The Generals came from behind and beat Huntsville 11-8 at Joe Davis Stadium. It was Paxton's shortest outing of theseason.

**SL Pitcher of the Week:** Generals lefty James Paxton was named the Southern League Pitcher of the Week for his efforts in the first 11 days of the 2012 season. Paxton made two starts and was 1-0, with a 0.87 ERA striking out 17 and walking just one batter in 10 1/3 innings. He fanned 10 batters in his first start on April 6 against the Barons and struck out seven in his second outing last Thursday against the Smokies.

**Highly Ranked:** Paxton ranks as the 4th best prospect in the Mariners organization, according to *Baseball America*. He ranks as the 8th best left-handed pitching prospect and 77th overall prospect in baseball, according to MLB.com

**2011 Season in Review:** Combined to go 6-3 with a 2.37 ERA (25 ER, 95.0 IP) in 17 starts with A Clinton and AA Jackson...recorded 131 strikeouts, T2nd-most among Mariners farmhands...among all minor league players with at least 90.0 IP, ranked 2nd averaging 12.41 K/9.0 IP...tallied 6 games with 10+ strikeouts...

**Pax To the Future:** Paxton was named to the 2011 XM Satellite Radio All-Star Futures Game as part of the MLB All-Star festivities at Chase Field in Phoenix, AZ. Paxton tossed a shutout third frame on July 10th. Paxton started the third inning as part of the World Team in the Futures Game. The 6-foot-4, 220-pounder needed just six pitches to retire three of the top prospects in baseball - hitting 1-2-3 in the order - Cleveland Indians second baseman Jason Kipnis, Baltimore Orioles shortstop Manny Machado and Bryce Harper, the Washington Nationals outfielder and former No. 1 overall pick in the 2010 MLB Draft, currently ranked as the No. 1 prospect in baseball.

**Jump from Low-A to Double-A:** Transferred from Low-A Clinton to Jackson on 6/30. He went 3-3 with a 2.73 ERA (17 ER in 56.0 IP), struck out 80 while walking 30 and limiting opponents to a .225 average. Paxton struck out 10-plus batters on a team-best three separate occasions, including a 13-strikeout game against Quad Cities on June 16 leading up to the Midwest League All-Star Game.

**Pro Debut:** Made his long-awaited professional debut for Clinton on 4/27 vs. Peoria and took the loss despite making a quality start...he allowed three runs on five hits including a two-run HR by Greg Rohan, walked four and struck out six over 6.0 innings in Clinton's 7-2 loss. He'd miss his next scheduled outing for 5/2 vs. Beloit after being hit in the left shoulder by a ball during batting practice, but would return on schedule for his next start, 5/8 vs. Burlington.

**Indy Ball in 2010:** Did not immediately sign after being selected in the 4th round of the 2010 June draft...made 4 starts for Grand Prairie in the independent American Association (1-2 4.08 ERA, 18 SO, 7 BB) prior to the 2010 draft.

**Time at Kentucky:** three-time member of the SEC Academic Honor Roll...pitched for the University of Kentucky from 2007-09...was 11-5 with a 4.91 ERA (81 ER, 148.1 IP) and 168 strikeouts in 55 games (24 starts) for the Wildcats...finished his junior season (2009) ranked 17th in the nation and 4th in the Southeastern Conference with 115 strikeouts...also ranked 3rd in the NCAA averaging 13.22 strikeouts per 9.0 innings...selected by Toronto in the

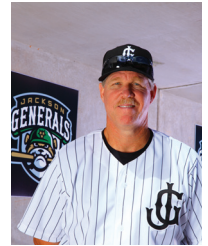
