Generals wins this season, T-2nd most in minor league baseball.

TODAY'S GAME: This afternoon the Generals look for their first series sweep of the season against the Tennessee Smokies and a seventh straight win. The Generals are T-2nd in all of minor league baseball with 17 wins. Only the Florida State League's St. Lucie Mets have more at 18-4, The Dunedin Blue Jays (17-5), Midwest League's Lansing Lugnuts (17-6), PCL's Fresno Grizzlies (17-6), and Omaha Storm Chasers (17-6) have 17 wins.

GENERALS RECAP: Joherymn Chavez went 4x4 with 2 runs scored, 1 double, 1 home run and 2 RBI to lead the Generals won their 6th straight with a 6-4 win over Tennessee on Saturday night. DH Joe Dunigan (3x4, 3 R, 2B, HR, 2 RBI) added a 3x4 with his league leading 7th home run and 2 RBI. Starter Brandon Maurer (5.0, 6, 3, 3, 3, 3) allowed 3 runs on 6 hits in 5.0 innings to pick up his 1st win of the season. LH Brian Moran allowed only 1 hit in 1.2 scoreless innings to extend his scoreless streak to 11.2 innings to begin the season. RH Stephen Pryor (1.2, 1, 0, 0, 1, 0) recorded the last 5 outs to pick up his 6th save of the season.

WHO'S HOT?: Joe Dunigan has hit in each of his last 4 games, batting .438 (7x16) with 6 runs scored, 3 doubles, 2 home runs and 4 RBI. Chris Pettit has hit safely in 5 straight games, batting .368 (7x19) with 3 runs scored, 3 doubles, 1 triple and 3 RBI. Denny Almonte went 0x4 yesterday ending his hitting streak at 9 games, but has hit safely in 12 of his last 15 games. During the last 15 games he is batting .414 (24x58) with 8 runs scored, 3 doubles, 6 home runs and 13 RBI. During this stretch he has raised his season average from .179 to .358. Rich Poythress went 0x4 yesterday ending his hitting streak at 11 games. During the streak he hit .381 (16x42) with 9 runs scored, 5 doubles, 1 home run and 10 RBI. LH Brian Moran (11.2) and RH Moises Hernandez (9.0) have yet to allow a run this season.

DOMINATING THE LEAGUE: The Generals pitching staff has struck out a league-best 217 batters so far this season and also lead the league with a 2.41 ERA. The next closest team to Jackson is Mobile at 3.24.

ORGANIZATIONAL RANKINGS: The Mariners were recently ranked by Baseball America No. 6 in their annual organizational talent ratings...this is a drastic improvement from when the Mariners were ranked 18th prior to last season.

25 STRAIGHT GAMES: The Generals are in the midst of the longest stretch of games without a day off. Jackson plays everyday from April 5 to April 29, having their first day off finally on April 30.

GENERALS BOAST FOUR TOP 100 PROSPECTS: The Generals opening day roster features four top 100 prospects, according to MLB.com. Pitchers Danny Hultzen (16), Taijuan Walker (18) and James Paxton (77) and short stop Nick Franklin (52).

MARINERS FUTURE IN JACKSON: Baseball America lists 10 Generals as top 30 Mariners prospects in their latest publication, including the top four and five of the top six on the list. P Taijuan Walker (1), P Danny Hultzen (2), P James Paxton (3), INF Nick Franklin (4), INF Francisco Martinez (6), P Stephen Pryor (15), P Carter Capps (16), P Brandon Maurer (21), OF Joherymn Chavez (28), INF Rich Poythress (29)

Tonight's Start: 22-year-old left-hander Danny Hultzen makes his 5th minor league start this afternoon for the Generals against the Tennessee Smokies at Pringles Park. The rookie out of Bethesda, MD has won 2 straight and comes in with a streak of 12 scoreless innings. Hultzen ranks 1st in the SL in opponents average at .122, 2nd in WHIP, 0.98 and 6th in ERA, 2.08.

Last Outing: Hultzen won his second straight start last Monday morning against Huntsville allowing just 2 hits in 5.2 shutout innings. Hultzen struck out five and walked three throwing a season high 97 pitches. The Generals defeated Huntsville 8-1 in the series finale.

Topping the Rankings: Enters the season ranked as the No. 16 prospect in baseball by MLB.com...also listed as the No. 3 LHP prospect by the website. Ranked by Baseball America as the Mariners No. 3 prospect, and the pitcher possessing the best control and changeup.

Arizona Fall League: Played for the Peoria Javelinas in the Arizona Fall League...went 1-0 with 1.40 ERA (3 ER, 19.1 IP) in 6 starts. Named to the 2011 Arizona Fall League Top Prospects Team. Was the starting pitcher (West squad) in the Arizona Fall League Rising Stars Game. Ranked 3rd in the AFL in ERA (1.40) and 5th among starters in opponent avg (.225). Held opponents to a .225 batting average (16x71), including .118 (2x17) vs. lefty batters. Allowed 1 run or fewer in all 6 starts, including 3 scoreless starts.

No. 2 Pick in 2011 Draft: Hultzen is the second starting pitcher to wear the Jackson uniform. The first being Mark Prior (#2 for Cubs in 2001) who played for the Diamond Jaxx in 2002. Hultzen signed at the draft signing deadline on Aug. 15 for \$8.6 million. #1 pick was RHP Gerrit Cole of UCLA and #3 was RHP Trevor Bauer of UCLA.

Junior Season at Virginia: Began the season as the Opening Day starter for the University of Virginia on Feb. 18 (vs.UAB) and had his last AFL start Nov. 12.As junior at the University of Virginia, went 12-3 with a 1.37 ERA (18 ER, 118.0 IP) with 165 strikeouts in 18 starts...led Virginia to the College World Series. Finalist for the Golden Spikes and Dick Howser Player of the Year awards...unanimous First-Team All-American...First-Team All-ACC and ACC Pitcher of the Year. Won the 2011 John Olerud Two-Way Player of the Year Award...batted .309 (42x136) with 11 doubles, 2 triples, 1 home run and 35 RBI.

Career at Virginia: Went 32-5 with a 2.08 ERA (74 ER, 320.0 IP) in 51 G/50 GS during his three years at Virginia...holds UVa career record with 32 wins, T14th in ACC history in career wins...broke the Virginia career strikeout record (395)...also ranked 2nd-best in school history in ERA (2.08) and innings pitched (320.0)...averaged 11.1 K/9.0 IP during his career...was a three-time all-ACC selection...two-time ACC Pitcher of the Year (2010 & 2011).

High School Days: Attended St. Albans School in Washington, DC...named high school First-Team All-American by Baseball America and Collegiate Baseball in 2008 (13-0, 0.74 ERA, 140 K, 73.0 IP)...selected by Arizona in 10th round of 2008 MLB Draft but did not sign and went to Virginia.
