Record when Jackson homers in a game...

TODAY'S GAME: The Generals continue their 5-game homestand today at 12:05 against the Pensacola Blue Wahoos. This is Pensacola's 1st ever trip to Pringles Park. The Generals lead the season series, 4-3. Jackson has is a season best 10 games above .500, 31-21 and hold a 2 1/2 game lead in the SL North Division.

GENERALS RECAP: The Generals claimed their 2nd win over the Pensacola Blue Wahoos on Tuesday night by the score of 4-2. The victory extended Jackson's winning streak to 3 games. Pensacola scored in the 1st inning off an RBI double by Brodie Greene. The Generals answered right back in the bottom of the 1st with 2 runs on three hits. **Francisco Martinez** began the inning with a double to left and later scored on a sacrifice fly by **Denny Almonte**. **Joe Dunigan** reached second on a line drive to center and was driven home by a **Jesus Sucre** single. Jackson scored two more runs in the game, both thanks to solo home runs off RH J.C. Sulbaran (3-4, 4.58). **Chih-Hsien Chiang** hit his 1st Jackson home run in the 4th inning. **Kalian Sams** followed up in the 6th inning with his 4th homer of the year. Sams ended the night with 3 hits, the only multi-hit night for Jackson. LH **Steve Garrison** (3-1, 3.00) pitched 6 innings, giving up seven hits, two runs, two walks, and striking out two. **Yoervis Medina** was credited with his third hold of the year. **Stephen Hensley** earned his 2nd save of the year after striking out all three Pensacola batters in the ninth.

TOPS IN THE LEAGUE: The Generals are tied with Mobile for the best record in the Southern League, 31-21 on the year. The Generals also lead the league in ERA at 2.92. The next closest is Mobile with a 3.28 ERA.

PAXTON PLACED ON DL: Generals starter **James Paxton** was placed on the DL Tuesday with a sore right knee and will miss today's start. Paxton left Saturday's start after 2 2/3 innings with discomfort in his right knee.

WHO'S HOT?: INF **Nick Franklin** has hit safely in 9 of his last 11 games, batting .390 (16x41) with 5 runs scored, 5 doubles, 4 triples and 6 RBI. -> LH **Bobby LaFromboise** has allowed only 1 earned run in his last 22.0 innings in relief (0.41 ERA). During his last 13 relief appearances he has limited opponents to a .145 average (11x76), while walking 4 and striking out 24. He has not allowed a hit to the last 16 batters faced (1 BB, 5 K).

THE INCREDIBLE HULTZ: After allowing 5 runs in 4.0 innings in his first start of the season, **Danny Hultzen** has allowed only 5 earned runs in 52.2 innings (0.86 ERA), lowering his ERA from 11.25 to 1.59 ERA. Overall in 10 starts this season, Hultzen is 5-3 with a league best 1.59 ERA (10 ER, 56.2 IP). He has limited opponents to a league best .155 average (30x193), while walking 25 and striking out a league best 61.

THE VETERAN CAMPBELL REACHING: 27-year-old utility man **Eric Campbell** has reached base in 21 straight games, the 2nd longest active streak in the Southern League (1 behind Mobile's Mark Krauss). During the streak Campbell is batting .307, with 2 home runs and 13 RBI.

THE FLAME THROWER: RH **Carter Capps** has not allowed a run in his last 12.2 innings in relief (9 games). This season he is 2-2 with 5 saves and a 1.78 ERA (5 ER, 25.1 IP). He has limited opponents to a .219 (21x96) average, while walking 5 and striking out 35. Capps has held opponents scoreless in 15 of 18 relief appearances this season. His 12.43 strikeouts per 9.0 innings currently ranks 3rd amongst relievers in the Southern League.

HOMECOMING FOR HAYES: Former McKenzie High School standout, Bethel Wildcat and Vanderbilt Commodore **Drew Hayes** is a member of the Pensacola bullpen. He will make his 1st minor league appearance at Pringles Park this week. Hayes is 0-2, with a 5.23 ERA this season in 21 relief appearances. Hayes pitched at Pringles Park on May 6, 2008 with Vanderbilt against Memphis. He struck out a career high 12 in 7 innings with just 1 walk.

GENERALS BOAST FOUR TOP 100 PROSPECTS: The Generals opening day roster features four top 100 prospects, according to MLB.com. Pitchers **Danny Hultzen** (16), **Taijuan Walker** (18) and **James Paxton** (77) and short stop **Nick Franklin** (52).

Tonight's Start: 25-year-old right-hander Taylor Stanton makes his first Jackson start this season after being promoted from Class-A Advanced High Desert. He takes the place of James Paxton (DL) in the rotation.

Last Outing: On Saturday, Stanton tossed 4 shutout innings, striking out 3 and walking none in High Desert's 3-2 win over Modesto. Stanton was coming off a complete game in his last start against Lancaster, earning the win. (9IP, 11H,4R,4ER, 6SO, 1BB).

Promoted to Jackson: Stanton was promoted to Jackson on 5/29 when James Paxton was placed on the 7-day DL. Stanton was 2-1, with a 6.08 ERA in 13 games, 4 starts with Advanced-A High Desert.

Double-A Debut in 2011: Split season between High Desert and Jackson (May 13-Aug. 4)...on the DL April 23-May 2 with a muscle strain in back.

Midwest League in 2010: Tied for the Midwest league lead and led all Mariners minor leaguers with 12 wins with Clinton...struck out career-high 14 batters over 7.0 innings on Aug. 25 vs. Quad Cities...
