Chance of rain at 7:05 tonight in Jackson...

**TODAY'S GAME:** The Generals continue their 5-game homestand tonight at 7:05 against the Pensacola Blue Wahoos. This is Pensacola's first ever trip to Pringles Park. Jackson and Pensacola have split the first 8 games this season.

**GENERALS RECAP:** The Generals had their 3-game winning streak snapped on Wednesday to Pensacola, 7-3 at Pringles Park. The Wahoos scored all 7 runs in the first 3 innings and coasted to their first victory of series. Pensacola scored a run in the 1st, 2 in the second and 4 in the third against Generals starter **Taylor Stanton** (0-1). The righty, making his Jackson debut tossed 2.2 innings and allowed 7 runs (6 earned) on 9 hits. Relievers **Mauricio Robles** and **Brian Moran** combined to hold Pensacola scoreless over the final 6 1/3 innings. The Generals scored 2 runs in the fourth inning on an RBI triple by **Chih-Hsien Chiang** and an RBI groundout by **Steven Proscia**. Jackson trimmed the margin to the final tally of 7-3 in the ninth with a double by **Chris Pettit** that scored **Kalian Sams**. **Chih-Hsien Chiang** was 2-for-4 in the game, scoring a run and **Nick Franklin** was 2-for-4 with a double. Kyle Lotzkar (2-1) picked up the win for the Blue Wahoos striking out 8 over 6 innings on the mound.

**TOPS IN THE LEAGUE:** The Generals are tied with Mobile for the best record in the Southern League, 31-22 on the year. The Generals also lead the league in ERA at 2.98. The next closest is Mississippi with a 3.30 ERA.

**WHO'S HOT?:** INF **Nick Franklin** has hit safely in 10 of his last 12 games, batting .400 (18x45) with 5 runs scored, 6 doubles, 4 triples and 6 RBI...Franklin has recorded an extra-base hit in each of his last 5 games.

**MARINERS SCORE 21 RUNS:** The 21 runs scored were tied for 2nd-most in a game in club history, equaling the record for most runs in a road game, and just the 3rd time to score 20 runs in a game (first since 9/30/00 at ANA). It was the most runs scored by an MLB team this season (prev: 18 by Colorado & Texas), and most runs scored since the Yankees beat the A's 22-9 on Aug. 25, 2011.

**THE INCREDIBLE HULTZ:** After allowing 5 runs in 4.0 innings in his first start of the season, **Danny Hultzen** has allowed only 5 earned run in 52.2 innings (0.85 ERA), lowering his ERA from 11.25 to 1.59 ERA. During this stretch he has limited opponents to a .153 average (27x177), while walking 24 and striking out 54. Overall in 10 starts this season, Hultzen is 5-3 with a 1.59 ERA (10 ER, 56.2 IP). He has limited opponents to a .155 average (30x193), which is the lowest in the Southern League, while walking 27 and striking out 61. Hultzen currently leads the Southern League in ERA (1.59), strikeouts (61), opponents average (.155) and WHIP (1.01), while leading all starters with the fewest baserunners per 9.0 innings (9.37).

**THE VETERAN CAMPBELL REACHING:** 27-year-old utility man **Eric Campbell** has reached base in 21 straight games, the 2nd longest active streak in the Southern League (1 behind Mobile's Mark Krauss). During the streak Campbell is batting .307, with 2 home runs and 13 RBI.

**THE FLAME THROWER:** RH **Carter Capps** has not allowed a run in his last 12.2 innings in relief (9 games). This season he is 2-2 with 5 saves and a 1.78 ERA (5 ER, 25.1 IP). He has limited opponents to a .219 (21x96) average, while walking 5 and striking out 35. Capps has held opponents scoreless in 15 of 18 relief appearances this season. His 12.43 strikeouts per 9.0 innings currently ranks 3rd amongst relievers in the Southern League.

**HOMECOMING FOR HAYES:** Former McKenzie High School standout, Bethel Wildcat and Vanderbilt Commodore **Drew Hayes** is a member of the Pensacola bullpen. He will make his 1st minor league appearance at Pringles Park this week. Hayes is 0-2, with a 5.23 ERA this season in 21 relief appearances. Hayes pitched at Pringles Park on May 6, 2008 with Vanderbilt against Memphis. He struck out a career high 12 in 7 innings with just 1 walk.

**GENERALS BOAST FOUR TOP 100 PROSPECTS:** The Generals opening day roster features four top 100 prospects, according to MLB.com. Pitchers **Danny Hultzen** (16), **Taijuan Walker** (18) and **James Paxton** (77) and short stop **Nick Franklin** (52).

**Tonight's Start:** 21-year-old right-hander Brandon Maurer makes the start for the Generals against Pensacola in game four of the five-game set. It's his 54th career outing, 45th career start for the fifth-year right-hander out of Costa Mesa, CA.

**Last Outing:** Maurer took a no decision last Saturday in Montgomery after allowing 3 runs on 10 hits over 5.0 innings. Maurer struck out 6 and walked 2. The Generals allowed 10 runs in the 6th inning and lost 16-3 at Montgomery.

**2011 in Review:** Began season with Clinton...struck out a season high 11 batters May 7 vs. Burlington (6.0,3,1,1,2,11,BK)...promoted to High Desert on May 17...named California League Pitcher of the Week, May 23-29, after allowing only 3 hit over 8.0 shutout innings, Aug. 25 vs. Modesto (8.0,3,0,0,0,9)...made two stints on the disabled list with a strained right elbow (June 11-29 and July 18-end of season).

**Injury Laden Season in 2010:** Began season on the disabled list with right elbow tendonitis and reinstated on Aug. 13...appeared in games with Peoria (Aug. 13-29) and Clinton (Aug. 30-remainder of season)...participated in Mariners Instructional League...
