Generals closer Carter Capps...

**TODAY'S GAME:** The Generals continue their series in Pensacola, with game 3 of the 5 game set at Maritime Park. Jackson leads the current series 1-0 and lead the season series against the Wahoos 7-4. Jackson is 3-3 in games played in Pensacola this season.

**GENERALS RECAP:** 3B Nate Tenbrink led off the game with a solo home run and starter Steve Garrison held the Wahoos to 1 run over 6.0 innings as Jackson defeated Pensacola 4-2 on Tuesday night. Tenbrink went 4x5 with 2 runs scored, 1 home run and 2 RBI in only his 3rd game this season with Jackson since returning from the disabled list. 2B **Stefen Romero** (2x3, RBI, BB) picked up his 5th multi-hit game and extended his hitting streak to 6 games since his promotion from High Desert. RF **Kalian Sams** (2x3, R, 2B, BB, SB) recorded the Generals other multi-hit game, going 2x3 with 1 double and 1 walk. Garrison (6.0,4.1,1.2,2) earned his 5th win of the season, allowing 1 run on 4 hits in 6.0 innings. LH **Mauricio Robles** (1.1,0,0,0,0,3) struck out 3 batters in 1.1 innings in relief, while RH **Carter Capps** (1.0,1,0,0,0,2) allowed 1 hit and struck out 2 in a scoreless 9th inning to pick up his 12th save of the season.

**HOT HITTING ROMERO:** INF **Stefen Romero** has hit safely in all 6 games he has appeared with 5 multi-hit games with Jackson since his promotion. During this stretch is batting .428 (11x23) with 4 runs scored, 3 doubles, 1 triple, 1 home run and 8 RBI. Combined Romero is batting .367 this season.

**HOMER'N JOE:** Joe Dunigan won the Southern League Home Run Derby last Tuesday in Kodak, TN. Lately games have been a Home Run Derby for Dunigan, now T-2nd in the SL with 14 home runs on the year. He has hit 6 homers in his last 15 games.

**WHO'S HOT?:** OF **Chih-Hsien Chiang** has hit safely in 9 of 10 games with 6 multi-hit contests, batting .349 (15x43) with 3 runs scored, 6 doubles and 11 RBI.

-> INF **Eric Campbell** has hit safely in 7 of his last 8 games, batting .333 (10x30) with 8 runs scored, 2 home runs and 2 RBI.

-> RH **Yoervis Medina** has not allowed a run in his last 15.0 innings over his last 10 relief appearances (since May 25). During this stretch he has lowered his ERA from 7.83 to 4.74, while limiting opponents to a .192 (10x52) with 6 walks and 15 strikeouts.

**FOR STARTERS:** In his last 3 starts, LH **Steve Garrison** is 2-0 with a 1.80 ERA (4 ER, 20.0 IP) while 2 and striking out 12. After recording only 1 quality start in his first 7 starts, he has recorded one in each of his last 3 starts.

**PANK TO THE FUTURE...WALKER TOO:** Generals Manager Jim Pankovits was selected as a coach for the U.S. All-Star team and will coach along side manager George Brett. RHP **Taijuan Walker** was selected to play for the U.S. squad in the 14th annual SiriusXM All-Star Futures Game to be played July 8 at Kauffman Stadium in Kansas City (2 p.m. PT/ESPN2, MLB Network Radio) as part of All-Star weekend. Walker is 4-3 with a 3.79 ERA (24 ER, 57.0 IP) in 12 starts with Jackson. He has limited opponents to a .249 (53x247) average, while walking 23 and striking out 59 in 57.0 innings.

**FIRST HALF CHAMPIONS:** Jackson won their 4th first half Championship in club history with a 42-28 record and ended the half with a 7-game lead in the division. The 42 first half wins ranked 3rd all-time in franchise history during a first half.

**HIGH-A MAVS WIN FIRST HALF:** The Mariners High-A affiliate High Desert came from a 5-2 deficit and scored 6 runs combined in the 5th and 6th inning to beat Rancho Cucamonga 8-5 on Monday night. The win secured the Mavericks the California League Southern Division first half title. The Mavericks currently lead the California League with a .300 (800x2669) average. High Desert also leads the league in runs scored (486), hits (800), doubles (172), home runs (104) and RBI (447).

**CAPPING OFF GAMES:** RH **Carter Capps** has not allowed an earned run in his last 24.1 innings in relief (18 games). This season he is 2-2 with 12 saves and a 1.22 ERA (5 ER, 37.0 IP). He has limited opponents to a .197 (27x137) average, while walking 10 and striking out 57. Capps has held opponents scoreless in 24 of 27 relief appearances this season. His 13.86 strikeouts per 9.0 innings currently ranks 2nd amongst all relievers in the Southern League.

**Tonight's Start:** 23-year-old right-hander Forrest Snow makes his 3rd Jackson start tonight since coming down from Tacoma, in game two against Pensacola. Tonight's start is the 69th career outing for the former Washington Huskies star and his 35th career start.

**Last Outing:** Snow tossed 5.1 innings in Jackson's 7-4 win against Huntsville last Friday at Pringles Park. Snow picked up a no decision. He allowed 4 runs on 5 hits in the outing, walking 2 and striking out 6.

**Top Rated Prospect:** Snow is rated as the No. 19 prospect for the Mariners according to Baseball America.

**Transferred to Jackson:** Snow was sent to Jackson from AAA Tacoma on 6/14 as LHP Bobby LaFromboise and RHP Steven Hensley were promoted to Tacoma. Snow was 1-4, with a 8.42 ERA for the Rainiers in 13 games and 11 starts.

**Personal History for Snow:** Forrest's father, Fielding, played baseball at San Diego State...Forrest graduated from the Lakeside School (Seattle, WA) in June, 2007...named first-team All-Metro League and honorable mention all-state as a junior and senior...played on a Northwest All-Star "Mariners Cup" team that played against a California all-star team...drafted by Seattle in the 44th round of 2007 June draft, but did not sign...

**Attended the U of Washington:** attended the University of Washington from 2008-10...went 6-2 in 46 career appearances (12 starts) for the Huskies.

**Jump from Single-A to Triple-A in 2011:** Split season between Clinton (April 7-June 14), High Desert (June 15-July 23) and Tacoma (July 24-end of season)...finished 4th amongst all Mariners farmhands with 127 strikeouts...after serving as Clinton's closer in 2010, made move to rotation and was Opening Night starter on April 7 vs. Burlington (3.0,4,4,3,2,4,WP,HB)...tossed first-career complete game April 29 at Wisconsin (G#2), allowing 1 run in 7.0 innings (7.0,5,1,1,1,7,HR)...struck out a career-high 9 batters twice with Tacoma: July 24 at Salt Lake City (6.0,7,3,3,1,9,HR) and Aug. 17 vs. Omaha (7.0,4,1,1,1,9)...played for the Peoria in the Arizona Fall League...led AFL with a 1.10 ERA (2 ER, 16.1 IP), and 2nd in opponent avg (.167) and WHIP (0.80)...

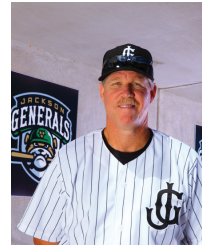
