League-leading saves from Jackson closer Carter Capps...

TODAY'S GAME: The Generals wrap up their 4-game series in 3 days against Huntsville with a scheduled double-header. The Generals are 5-3 in 7-inning games. Jackson leads the SL North standings by 1/2 game over Chattanooga. Huntsville is the only team in the league with a winning record against the Generals (9-8).

GENERALS RECAP: Starter Taijuan Walker allowed 1 run in 6.0 innings and LF Kallian Sams hit his 9th home run of the season to lead Jackson to a 7-3 win over Huntsville on Friday night. Walker (6.0, 5.1, 1.2, 3) allowed 1 run on 5 hits in 6.0 innings to record his 6th win this season. Closer Carter Capps (2.0, 3.0, 0.0, 5, WP) recorded his 18th save in 20 chances this season and marked the 10th time this season to toss more than an inning to record a save. RH Chih-Hsien Chiang extended his hitting streak to 10 games with a 1x4 with 2 RBI. Sams (2x3, 2 R, HR, RBI, BB) and Leury Bonilla (2x4, R, 3B) each recorded 2 of Jackson's 10 hits.

THRIVING IN THE JULY HEAT: The Generals have a league-best record of 12-5 during the month of July. Jackson also has a league-best batting average in July, .277 and a league-best ERA of 3.29.

"KISS IT GOODBYE?": Over the course of the last 6 games, the Generals have hit 9 home runs, including 3 multi-homer games. During the past 4 games, Jackson has scored 29 runs. In 17 games in July, Jackson has hit 16 home runs and currently leads the league with 77 homers.

FEELS GOOD AT THE TOP: The Generals 59 wins are the most in the Southern League. Jackson ranks 1st in pitching, with a 3.16 ERA and T-2nd in team batting average at .263. The Generals lead the league in total bases, slugging percentage and home runs with 77.

WHO'S HOT?: OF Chih-Hsien Chiang is batting .378 (17x45) with 8 runs scored, 4 doubles, 2 home runs and 4 RBI during his current 10-game hit streak. -> INF Rich Poythress has hit safely in 14 of his last 15 games, batting .412 (21x51) with 7 runs scored, 4 doubles and 6 RBI.

-> OF Denny Almonte is batting .313 (10x32) with 9 runs scored, 4 doubles, 2 triples and 9 RBI in his 6 games with an at-bat. -> RH Yorvis Medina has allowed 1 run in his last 25.2 innings in relief (0.35 ERA). During this 16 game stretch has limited opponents to a .208 (19x91) average, while walking 8 and striking out 25.

-> LH Mauricio Robles is 1-0 with 1.33 ERA (3 ER, 20.1 IP) in last 16 appearances. During this stretch he has limited opponents to a .094 (6x64) average while walking 14 and striking out 16. In 3 starts since returning from the DL on July 3.

VIVA LA ROMERO: INF Stefan Romero has hit safely 20 of 23 games with 12 multi-hit games with Jackson since his promotion, batting .367 (33x90) with 17 runs scored, 10 doubles, 2 triple, 4 home runs and 27 RBI.

K-PAX IS BACK: In 3 starts since returning from the DL on July 3, LH James Paxton is 1-0 with a 1.26 ERA (2 ER, 14.1 IP). He has limited opponents to a .296 (16x54) average, while walking 2 and striking out 16.

CAPPING OFF GAMES: RH Carter Capps has allowed only 2 earned runs (3 R) over his last 35.1 (0.51 ERA). This season he is 2-3 with 18 saves and a 1.31 ERA (7 ER, 48.0 IP). He has limited opponents to a .214 (39x182) average, while walking 12 and striking out 70. Capps has held opponents scoreless in 32 of 36 relief appearances this season.

FERNANDEZ MANIA: LH Anthony Fernandez became the first Jackson pitcher in franchise history to post back-to-back 9-inning complete games in his first 2 starts. In 5 starts since being promoted for High Desert to Jackson, Fernandez is 4-0 with a 2.12 ERA (8 ER, 34.0 IP).

FIRST HALF CHAMPIONS: Jackson won their 4th first half Championship in club history with a 42-28 record and ended the half with a 7-game lead in the division. The 42 first half wins ranked 3rd all-time in franchise history during a first half.

RECORD SETTING NIGHT: Last Thursday, the Generals broke the Southern League record for doubles in one game with 11, eclipsing the previous mark of 10 set by the Mobile BayBears on May 25, 2000. The Generals also matched the league mark with 13 extra-base hits, becoming the first team to do so without the benefit of a homer.

PRYOR ON REHAB ASSIGNMENT IN TACOMA: Former General RH Stephen Pryor is currently on an MLB rehab assignment with the Rainiers. The reliever was placed on Seattle's 15-Day Disabled List on June 13 with a strained left groin. He picked up 2 saves over 9.0 scoreless outings with Tacoma prior to his first MLB promotion on June 1. Pryor has allowed 2 hits, walked 3 and struck out 2 in 4.0 scoreless innings in 4 relief appearances with Tacoma. He went 0-0 with a 6.75 ERA (2 ER, 2.2 IP), while walking 3 and striking out 3 in 2 rehab appearances with Single-A High Desert (July 9-11)....

THIS DAY IN BASEBALL HISTORY

2004 A third piece of concrete, which apparently fell from the park's upper deck, is discovered at Wrigley Field by a club employee. Two other chunks have also fallen recently in different sections in the 90-year-old stadium prompting Mayor Richard Daley to say he would not hesitate to close sections -- or all -- of the facility to protect fans from potential harm.

1945 At Philadelphia's Shibe Park, the A's and Tigers play the second longest game in major league history. After 4 hours and 48 minutes, the 24 inning contest ends in a 1-1 tie with Les Mueller pitching 19 2/3 innings for Detroit.

Tonight's Start: 23-year-old left-hander James Paxton starts tonight in game 1 of the DH against Huntsville, at Pringles Park. This is Paxton's 35th career outing and 35th career start for the third-year right-hander out of Ladner, British Columbia, Canada.

Last Outing: Paxton earned his first win since May 3rd on Sunday at Smokies Park. Paxton logged his 4th quality start, tossing 6.0 innings, allowing 1 run on 8 hits, striking out 6 and walking 1. The Generals blasted 4 homers and defeated Tennessee 6-1.

Vs. the Stars: Paxton has made 2 starts against the Brewers AA affiliate and is 0-1, with an 8.64 ERA. In his last start against Hunsville on 5/8 at Pringles Park, a quality start allowing just 2 runs on 6 hits in 6.0 innings.

Stint on the DL, May 25-July 3: Paxton was placed on the DL on May 26 with a sore right knee. The lefty missed a little over a month before returning for a start on July 3rd at Pringles Park against Montgomery.

SL Pitcher of the Week: Generals lefty James Paxton was named the Southern League Pitcher of the Week for his efforts in the first 11 days of the 2012 season. Paxton made two starts and was 1-0, with a 0.87 ERA striking out 17 and walking just one batter in 10 1/3 innings. He fanned 10 batters in his first start on April 6 against the Barons and struck out seven in his second outing last Thursday against the Smokies.

Highly Ranked: Paxton ranks as the 4th best prospect in the Mariners organization, according to *Baseball America*. He ranks as the 8th best left-handed pitching prospect and 77th overall prospect in baseball, according to MLB.com

2011 Season in Review: Combined to go 6-3 with a 2.37 ERA (25 ER, 95.0 IP) in 17 starts with A Clinton and AA Jackson...recorded 131 strikeouts, T2nd-most among Mariners farmhands...among all minor league players with at least 90.0 IP, ranked 2nd averaging 12.41 K/9.0 IP...tallied 6 games with 10+ strikeouts...

Pax To the Future: Paxton was named to the 2011 XM Satellite Radio All-Star Futures Game as part of the MLB All-Star festivities at Chase Field in Phoenix, AZ. Paxton tossed a shutout third frame on July 10th. Paxton started the third inning as part of the World Team in the Futures Game. The 6-foot-4, 220-pounder needed just six pitches to retire three of the top prospects in baseball - hitting 1-2-3 in the order - Cleveland Indians second baseman Jason Kipnis, Baltimore Orioles shortstop Manny Machado and Bryce Harper, the Washington Nationals outfielder and former No. 1 overall pick in the 2010 MLB Draft, currently ranked as the No. 1 prospect in baseball.

Jump from Low-A to Double-A: Transferred from Low-A Clinton to Jackson on 6/30. He went 3-3 with a 2.73 ERA (17 ER in 56.0 IP), struck out 80 while walking 30 and limiting opponents to a .225 average. Paxton struck out 10-plus batters on a team-best three separate occasions, including a 13-strikeout game against Quad Cities on June 16 leading up to the Midwest League All-Star Game.

Pro Debut: Made his long-awaited professional debut for Clinton on 4/27 vs. Peoria and took the loss despite making a quality start...he allowed three runs on five hits including a two-run HR by Greg Rohan, walked four and struck out six over 6.0 innings in Clinton's 7-2 loss. He'd miss his next scheduled outing for 5/2 vs. Beloit after being hit in the left shoulder by a ball during batting practice, but would return on schedule for his next start, 5/8 vs. Burlington.

Indy Ball in 2010: Did not immediately sign after being selected in the 4th round of the 2010 June draft...made 4 starts for Grand Prairie in the independent American Association (1-2 4.08 ERA, 18 SO, 7 BB) prior to the 2010 draft.

Time at Kentucky: three-time member of the SEC Academic Honor Roll...pitched for the University of Kentucky from 2007-09...was 11-5 with a 4.91

Tonight's Start: 22-year-old left-hander Anthony Fernandez makes his 6th Jackson start tonight in game 2 of the double-header against Huntsville. This is Fernandez' 2nd start against the Stars and 2nd at home. . This is his 110th career outing and 69th career start.

Last Outing: Fernandez picked up his first no decision as a Jackson Generals Monday in game 2 of the series at Tennessee. He allowed 4 runs on 9 hits, striking out 4 and walking 2. The Generals defeated the Smokies 10-8 in a game that lasted 4 hours and 10 minutes.

Back-To-Back Complete Games: Fernandez became the first Jackson pitcher in franchise history to post back-to-back 9-inning complete games. Fernandez has allowed just 1 ER in 18.0 IP in his first two starts in Double-A, including a 2-hit, complete game shutout on Thursday night in Pensacola. Fernandez is 2-0, with a 0.50 ERA.

Promoted from High Desert to Jackson: On June 21st, Fernandez was promoted from High Desert to Jackson. He was 2-5, with a 3.68 ERA with the Mavs. In 88 innings pitched, he walked just 14 batters and struck out 79. In 10 of Fernandez' 14 A+ starts he went 6.0 innings or more.

2011 season split between Clinton and High Desert: Spent majority of season with Clinton, but also made 7 starts with High Desert (May 13-June 15)...led Clinton in wins (7), innings pitched (125.1), ERA (2.80) and quality starts (10)...lowered ERA 1.37 points over his final 14 outings (6-2, 2.07 ERA, 10 QS), finishing 5th in the league with a 2.80 ERA...ranked 5th the league in baserunners per 9.0 IP for starters (10.71) and T12th in WHIP (1.20)...tossed a career-high 9.0 innings on Aug. 13 at Peoria (9.0,5,1,1,0,9), but received a no decision...struck out career-high 10 over 5.0 innings on Aug. 19 vs. Quad Cities (5.0,4,2,2,3,10)...went 4-0 with 6 quality starts and a 1.65 ERA (9 ER, 49.1 IP) in 7 starts, July 23-Aug. 24...went 5-0 with a 1.91 ERA (15 ER, 70.2 IP) on the road...limited opponents to a .238 average (109x458), including a .200 (27x135) clip vs. lefties...picked off a team-best 8 baserunners in the regular season...allowed just 4 steals in 14 attempts (71.4% caught stealing average).

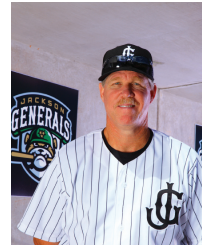
