Jackson starters ERA over the last 3 games (Walker/Paxton/Fernandez)...

TODAY'S GAME: The Generals begin a 5-game series today on the road against the Birmingham Barons (CHW). This is the lone visit Jackson pays to Regions Park. The Generals took 4 of 5 from the Barons, April 5-9 at Pringles Park to open the 2012 season.

GENERALS RECAP: Anthony Fernandez allowed 2 runs on 4 hits in the 1st inning, but surrendered just 3 hits over the next 6 innings. The effort wasn't enough on Saturday as Montgomery won the rubber match in 10 innings, 3-2. The loss dropped the Generals to 3-8 in extra inning affairs this season. Jackson trimmed a 2-0 deficit to 2-1 in the 3rd inning when Nate Tenbrink scored on an error by Mahtook, the Biscuits right fielder. The Generals tied the game at 2-2 in the sixth inning on an RBI groundout from Ralph Henriquez. The game went to extra innings tied at 2-2 and in the top of the 10th inning Mahtook delivered a sacrifice fly to right scoring Shawn O'Malley giving the Biscuits a 3-2 edge. Jackson starter Fernandez came away with a no decision despite allowing just 2 runs on 7 hits over 7.0 innings. Fernandez struck out 7 and walked none. Jandy Sena (1-2) allowed the winning run in the 10th and suffered the loss. Jackson's Brad Miller was 2-for-3, reaching base four times and Rich Poythress was 2-for-5, with a run scored.

THREE STRAIGHT QUALITY STARTS: The last 3 nights, Jackson starters have logged quality starts. Taijuan Walker, James Paxton and Anthony Fernandez have combined for 19.0 innings pitched, allowing just 3 runs logging a 1.42 ERA.

RECORD SETTING PACE: The Generals have reached the 61 win mark the fastest this season since 2005. The Generals are 4 games off the pace off of the 2005 Diamond Jaxx that won 83 games and 5 of the pace of the 1999 Diamond Jaxx that won a record 84 games.

MARINERS FUTURE IN JACKSON: With the addition of Brad Miller, the Generals roster currently contains 11 of the top 30 prospects in the Seattle Mariners organization, according to Baseball America, including 3 of the top 6. P Taijuan Walker (1), P James Paxton (3), INF Francisco Martinez (6), INF Brad Miller (11), P Carter Capps (16), P Forrest Snow (19), P Brandon Maurer (21), OF Chih-Hsien Chiang (24), P Mauricio Robles (26), OF Johermyn Chavez (28), INF Rich Poythress (29).

TURN-AROUND FOR TAIJUAN: RH Taijuan Walker is 2-0 with a 0.75 ERA (1 ER, 12.0 IP) over his last 2 starts. During this stretch he has limited opponents to a .167 (7x42) batting average, while walking 2 and striking out 11.

MAURER POWER: RH Brandon Maurer ranks 4th in the Southern League with a 3.51 ERA after posting his 11th quality start Tuesday night. Maurer leads the Generals in wins (7), strikeouts (96) and innings pitched (115.1). In 4 starts in July, Maurer is 2-0, with a 2.45 ERA (7 ER, 25.2 IP) in 4 starts in July. Since June 1 he is 5-1 with a 2.81 ERA (20 ER, 64.0 IP) in 10 starts. During this stretch has lowered his season ERA from 4.38 to 3.51.

"KISS IT GOODBYE": Over the course of the last 13 games, the Generals have hit 12 home runs, including 4 multi-homer games. The Generals lead the league with 80 homers this season.

BEST IN THE SOUTHERN LEAGUE: The Generals 61 wins are the most in the Southern League. Jackson leads the league in ERA (3.17), while ranking 2nd with a team batting average at .261 (906x3469). The Generals also lead the league in total bases (1388), slugging percentage (.400) and home runs with 80.

WHO'S HOT?: INF Brad Miller currently leads all Mariners farmhands with 47 multi-hit games this season, batting a combined .341 (146x428) with 91 runs scored, 33 doubles, 5 triples, 12 home runs and 58 RBI. His 146 hits are currently T-2nd-most in the Minor Leagues this season, while 91 runs scored rank 3rd and his 33 doubles rank T-7th.

-> RH Yoervis Medina has allowed 1 run in his last 29.2 innings in relief (0.31 ERA). During this 18 game stretch has limited opponents to a .206 (21x102) average, while walking 10 and striking out 27.

VIVA LA ROMERO: INF Stefan Romero has hit safely 24 of 30 games with 14 multi-hit games with Jackson since his promotion, batting .336 (39x116) with 18 runs scored, 11 doubles, 2 triple, 4 home runs and 27 RBI.

K-PAX IS BACK: In 5 starts since returning from the DL on July 3, LH James Paxton is 2-0 with a 2.39 ERA (7 ER, 26.1 IP). He has limited opponents to a .278 (27x97) average, while walking 8 and striking out 24.

FERNANDEZ MANIA: LH Anthony Fernandez became the first Jackson pitcher in franchise history to post back-to-back 9-inning complete games in his first 2 starts. In 5 starts since being promoted to High Desert to Jackson, Anthony Fernandez is 4-1 with a 2.89 ERA (15 ER, 46.2 IP).

FIRST HALF CHAMPIONS: Jackson won their 4th first half Championship in club history with a 42-28 record and ended the half with a 7-game lead in the division. The 42 first half wins ranked 3rd all-time in franchise history during a first half.

2002 The Phillies trade 27-year-old third baseman Scott Rolen along with minor league reliever Doug Nickle to the Cardinals in exchange for infielder Placido Polanco, southpaw Bud Smith and reliever Mike Timlin. Reportedly, the former Philadelphia third sacker rejected a ten-year pact estimated to be worth \$140 million due to his feud with manager Larry Bowa.

2011 The Phillies acquire Hunter Pence from the last-place Astros for a trio of highly touted minor leaguers. The 28-year-old right-fielder joins Philadelphia with a .309 average, 11 homers and 62 RBIs.

Tonight's Start: 29-year-old right-hander makes the game one start tonight on the road in Birminham. This is Fox's first Jackson start and 108th of his career.

Last Outing: Made his 3rd rehab start for the AZL Mariners allowing no runs on 2 hits in 3.0 innings. Fox struck out 3 and walked none. His previous 2 outings were 1.0 and 2.0 inning outings.

ACTIVATED TO JACKSON ON 7/29:

- Fox was activated from Tacoma DL and from his rehab stint with the AZL Mariners, making first start against Birmingham.
- Was placed on the DL in Tacoma after his 3rd start April 15th against Fresno with a sore right shoulder.

PERSONAL:

- Graduated from Douglas (FL) High School in 2001.
- Attended the University of Central Florida.
- Played shortstop and pitched as a freshman and sophomore with the Golden Knights.
- As a junior, went 14-2 with a 1.85 ERA and 125 strikeouts and held opponents to a .191 average over 111.2 innings pitched en route to being named the Atlantic Sun Pitcher of the Year.
- Chosen by Collegiate Baseball News and Baseball America as a First-Team All-American and selected by USA Today/Baseball Weekly as a Second-Team All-American.
- Originally selected by the Minnesota Twins in the first round (35th overall) of the 2004 draft

2011 SEASON:

- Pitched the entire 2011 season at Triple-A Pawtucket in his second year as a player in the Red Sox organization.
- Led the International League after holding opponents to a .230 batting average (107x466), including limiting right-handers to a .207 average (56x271).
- Went 10-3 with a 4.15 ERA (51ERx110.2IP) over 21 starts and 0-1 with a 2.84 ERA (6ERx19.0IP) over 7 relief appearances with the PawSox.
- Chosen as an IL Mid-Season All-Star after going 5-3 with a 4.82 ERA (43ERx80.1IP) over 20 games (17 GS) before the break, then went 5-1 with a 2.55 ERA (14ERx49.1IP) over 8 starts in the second half of the season.
