Jackson's record against Chattanooga during the playoffs...

TODAY'S GAME: Tonight the Generals open postseason play in the SL North Division series with game one against the Chattanooga Lookouts at Pringles Park. Jackson finished the regular season 9-6 against the Lookouts and 3-2 at Pringles Park.

FACING THE LOOKOUTS: - The Generals are facing off against Chattanooga for the 2nd time in the playoffs. In 1999 West Tenn defeated Chattanooga 3-1 in the West Division Series and went on to lose to Orlando in the Championship Series. In 15 games Jackson batted .261 with 13 home runs and had a 3.98 pitching ERA. **PAXTON GETS GAME ONE START:** In 8 starts since returning from DL on July 3, LH James Paxton was 6-1 with a 2.40 ERA (16 ER, 70.0 IP). He has limited opponents to a .283 (60x212) average, while walking 22 and striking out 58. Overall in 21 starts this season Paxton finished 9-4 with a 3.05 ERA.

GENERALS IN THE POSTSEASON: The Jackson franchise makes its 7th appearance in the postseason in 2012. Overall the Generals are 17-20 in Southern League PS games. The last time Jackson was in the postseason was in 2010, falling to Tennessee in the North Division Series 3-1. Jackson has appeared in the Championship series 3 times, last in 2005. The only Jackson SL title came in 2000 over Jacksonville.

BREAKOUT SEASON FOR ROMERO: INF Stefan Romero has hit safely in 21 of his last 22 games with 10 multi-hit efforts, batting .375 (33x88) with 18 runs scored, 3 doubles, 2 triples, 7 home runs and 18 RBI. Romero has also hit safely 47 of 55 games (w/AB) with 25 multi-hit games with Jackson since his promotion, batting .347 (75x216) with 38 runs scored, 15 doubles, 4 triple, 12 home runs and 50 RBI.

HOME SWEET PRINGLES: The Generals won 6 of the last 8 home games of the regular season and are 44-26 at home this season as opposed to 35-35 on the road. During the month of August, the Generals were 10-3 at Pringles Park as opposed to 6-11 on the road.

TOPS IN THE SOUTHERN LEAGUE: The Generals lead the league in wins (79), pitching staff led the league in ERA (3.37). The Generals position players also lead the league in total bases (1878), slugging percentage (.404) and home runs (118), while tying first in average (.261).

3RD-BEST SEASON IN FRANCHISE HISTORY: The Generals 79 wins during the regular season was the 3rd-most in franchise history and most since 2005. The 2005 Diamond Jaxx won 83 games and the 1999 Diamond Jaxx won a record 84 games. Last season the Generals won just 68 games and the most won since becoming a Mariners affiliate in 2006 was 75 that season.

ERRORLESS SEASON FOR SUCRE: C Jesus Sucre was the only qualifying catcher in the league to not have an error this season. He led all SL catcher with a 1.000 fielding percentage (0 ER, 769 TC). He also finished 2nd in the league with a .444 (40 SB, 32 CS) caught stealing percentage.

GATOR CHOMP: C Mike Zunino hit safely in 10 of 14 games (w/AB) with Jackson, batting .333 (17x51) with 6 runs scored, 4 doubles, 3 home runs, 8 RBI and 5 walks.

HISTORIC SEASON FOR MARINERS MINORS: The Mariners 9 minor league affiliates wrapped up the 2012 season putting together one of the best seasons in club history, combining for a 496-406 (.550) record...the organization currently leads all Major League farm systems in wins (496) and winning percentage (.550)...the Mariners 496 organizational wins set a new record for more wins in a single season by any Major League farm system...six of the Mariners 9 affiliates qualified for the postseason in 2012.

MAURER NAMED SL PITCHER OF THE YEAR: RH Brandon Maurer Monday was named the league's most outstanding pitcher. He ranked 5th in the Southern League with a 3.20 ERA. He led the Generals in wins (9), strikeouts (117) and innings pitched (137.1). Since June 1 he is 7-1 with a 2.50 ERA (24 ER, 86.1 IP) with 10 quality starts in 14 starts. During this stretch has lowered his season ERA from 4.38 to 3.20. In 8 starts since returning from DL on July 3,

ALL STARS AMONG US: The Jackson Generals had 3 representatives on the team SL Postseason All-Star Team. Righthanded reliever Carter Capps was named the league's best relief pitcher, RH Brandon Maurer was named the league's top right-handed starting pitcher and Jesus Sucre was named the top catcher in the league.

"KISS IT GOODBYE!": Over the course of the last 48 games of the season, the Generals hit 50 home runs, including 15 multi-homer games. The Generals lead the league with 118 homers this season. Jacksonville is 2nd in the league with 107 home runs.

ALL ABOUT THE HITS: SS Brad Miller ranked 2nd amongst all Minor Leaguers this year with 186 hits. Only Reno's Adam Eaton (197) recorded more hits than Miller this season. Miller is batted .334 (186x557) with 110 runs scored, 40 doubles, 7 triples, 15 home runs and 68 RBI in 136 games combined between High Desert and Jackson. His 110 runs scored currently ranks 4th in the Minor Leagues, while his 40 doubles are T10th overall.

FIRST ROUND FRENZY: The Generals have had 4 Mariners 1st round picks on the roster this season. INF Nick Franklin ('09, #27, now in AAA Tacoma), RHP Taijuan Walker ('10, #43), LHP Danny Hultzen ('11, #2, now in AAA Tacoma) and C Mike Zunino ('12, #3)

MARINERS FUTURE IN JACKSON: With the addition of Brad Miller, the Generals roster currently contains 10 of the top 30 prospects in the Seattle Mariners organization, according to Baseball America, including 3 of the top 6, P James Paxton (3), INF Francisco Martinez (6), INF Brad Miller (11), P Forrest Snow (19), P Brandon Maurer (21), OF Chih-Hsien Chiang (24), P Mauricio Robles (26), OF Johermyn Chavez (28), INF Rich Poythress (29).

Tonight's Start: 23-year-old left-hander James Paxton starts tonight in game one of the Division Series against Chattanooga. This is Paxton's first career postseason start. Paxton has won 5 of his last 7 starts and is 5-2, with a 2.18 ERA at home. Paxton is a third-year right-hander out of Ladner, British Columbia, Canada.

Last Outing: Paxton won his final start of the regular season one week ago against Jacksonville. Paxton logged his 9th quality start of the season, 6.0 innings pitched and allowing 2 runs on 4 hits, striking out 6 and walking 2. Jackson defeated Jacksonville 7-3

Stint on the DL, May 25-July 3: Paxton was placed on the DL on May 26 with a sore right knee. The lefty missed a little over a month before returning for a start on July 3rd at Pringles Park against Montgomery.

SL Pitcher of the Week: Generals lefty James Paxton was named the Southern League Pitcher of the Week for his efforts in the first 11 days of the 2012 season. Paxton made two starts and was 1-0, with a 0.87 ERA striking out 17 and walking just one batter in 10 1/3 innings. He fanned 10 batters in his first start on April 6 against the Barons and struck out seven in his second outing last Thursday against the Smokies.

Highly Ranked: Paxton ranks as the 4th best prospect in the Mariners organization, according to *Baseball America*. He ranks as the 8th best left-handed pitching prospect and 77th overall prospect in baseball, according to MLB.com

2011 Season in Review: Combined to go 6-3 with a 2.37 ERA (25 ER, 95.0 IP) in 17 starts with A Clinton and AA Jackson...recorded 131 strikeouts, T2nd-most among Mariners farmhands...among all minor league players with at least 90.0 IP, ranked 2nd averaging 12.41 K/9.0 IP...tallied 6 games with 10+ strikeouts...

Pax To the Future: Paxton was named to the 2011 XM Satellite Radio All-Star Futures Game as part of the MLB All-Star festivities at Chase Field in Phoenix, AZ. Paxton tossed a shutout third frame on July 10th. Paxton started the third inning as part of the World Team in the Futures Game. The 6-foot-4, 220-pounder needed just six pitches to retire three of the top prospects in baseball - hitting 1-2-3 in the order - Cleveland Indians second baseman Jason Kipnis, Baltimore Orioles shortstop Manny Machado and Bryce Harper, the Washington Nationals outfielder and former No. 1 overall pick in the 2010 MLB Draft, currently ranked as the No. 1 prospect in baseball.

Jump from Low-A to Double-A: Transferred from Low-A Clinton to Jackson on 6/30. He went 3-3 with a 2.73 ERA (17 ER in 56.0 IP), struck out 80 while walking 30 and limiting opponents to a .225 average. Paxton struck out 10-plus batters on a team-best three separate occasions, including a 13-strikeout game against Quad Cities on June 16 leading up to the Midwest League All-Star Game.

Pro Debut: Made his long-awaited professional debut for Clinton on 4/27 vs. Peoria and took the loss despite making a quality start...he allowed three runs on five hits including a two-run HR by Greg Rohan, walked four and struck out six over 6.0 innings in Clinton's 7-2 loss. He'd miss his next scheduled outing for 5/2 vs. Beloit after being hit in the left shoulder by a ball during batting practice, but would return on schedule for his next start, 5/8 vs. Burlington.

Indy Ball in 2010: Did not immediately sign after being selected in the 4th round of the 2010 June draft...made 4 starts for Grand Prairie in the independent American Association (1-2 4.08 ERA, 18 SO, 7 BB) prior to the 2010 draft.

Time at Kentucky: three-time member of the SEC Academic Honor Roll...pitched for the University of Kentucky from 2007-09...was 11-5 with a 4.91 ERA (81 ER, 148.1 IP) and 168 strikeouts in 55 games (24 starts) for the Wildcats...finished his junior season (2009) ranked 17th in the nation and 4th in the Southeastern Conference with 115 strikeouts...also ranked 3rd in the
